A digital revolution—between the cheek and gums

► Besides bombarding your brain with radiation, dental x-rays have another major shortcoming: Dentists need a keen eye to find insidious problems on these tiny squares of film. But **new digital x-rays yield 90 percent less radiation and use a computer to help diagnose hidden dental problems.** The Computed Dental Radiography (CDR) system uses x-ray sensors instead of film, explains Howard Spielman, D.D.S., a restorative dentist in Manhattan.
